Frankfort – Oren Larry Depp, Jr., age 89, passed away on Tuesday, November 3, 2020. Services will be held 11:00 a.m. at Harrod Brothers Funeral Home on Friday, November 6, 2020. The family will receive friends at Harrod Brothers Funeral Home from 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. service time.

A native of Owensboro, Kentucky, Mr. Depp was born on August 3, 1931, to the late Oren Larry Depp, Sr., and Violet Grinstead Depp. He received his Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering from the University of Kentucky, where he was a member of Kappa Sigma Fraternity.
