Frankfort – Earl Thomas “Tommy” Wheat, age 89, passed away Wednesday, April 4, 2018. Services will be held at Forks of Elkhorn Baptist Church on Monday, April 9, 2018, at 10:00 a.m. with Rev. Todd Lester officiating. Burial will follow at Frankfort Cemetery. The family will receive friends at Harrod Brothers Funeral Home on Sunday, April 8, 2018 from 2:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m.
