Major Andrew Lewis Tommy Nelson, age 77, passed away Monday, February 16, 2015.

Services for Major Nelson will be 1:00 p.m. Saturday, February 21, 2015, at The Salvation Army of Frankfort with Major Tom Duperee officiating. Burial will follow in Sunset Memorial Gardens. Visitation will be at Harrod Brothers Funeral Home Friday from 5:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. and Saturday at The Salvation Army from 11:00 a.m. until the service.

He was born in Shelby County, Kentucky May 23, 1937. He was the son of the late Orville Lewis and Corene Peyton Nelson. He retired as a Major with The Salvation Army after 43 years of service. After retirement, he remained active and was often called upon to speak at seminars and functions.
