



Anne Dowling Ueltschi

August 20, 1936 - June 10, 2017

Anne Dowling Nicol Ueltschi, 80, a lifelong resident of Frankfort, died peacefully Saturday June 10, 2017, after a long illness. She was born August 20, 1936, to Mary Lusse Nicol and the late James Dowling Nicol.

Anne Dowling was a graduate of Frankfort High School, attended Sophie-Newcom College in New Orleans and was a member of the Kappa Kappa Gamma Sorority.

Upon returning to Frankfort, Anne embarked on her lifelong journey as mother, small business owner, craftswoman and musician. She spent many hours in her garden cultivating roses and various other plants that decorated both her home and yard.

As the owner of The House of Yarn, Anne Dowling was a cornerstone of Frankfort's knitting, needlepoint, embroidery and other similar crafts community. Undoubtedly her works and the works of those she helped and instructed can be found throughout Central Kentucky.

Anne's musical talent led her to become an accomplished pianist and organist. She played the piano for her own enjoyment and of those around her. For years she served various churches in the community playing the organ as needed when the regular organist was out.

Throughout Anne Dowling's adult life, she loved collecting antiques and was always involved in restoring those in need of repair. This was never more evident than in the restoration of her grandfather's house and its eventual designation on the National Historic Register.

Her other accomplishments included serving as a Girl Scout leader, a member of the Frankfort Independent School Board, a Co-Chairperson for the United Fund and through her close affiliation with her church, Anne volunteered to help those in need after Hurricane Katrina struck the Gulf Coast.

Anne Dowling is survived by her mother, Mary Lusse Nicol, Frankfort, her sister, Nancy Nicol Rhody (Donnie), Frankfort, her sons Frank B. Ueltschi (Mary Nell), Frankfort and Robert Ueltschi (Lisa), Winter Park, FL.

She will be missed by her grandchildren Georgia Ueltschi, Frankfort, Ian Ueltschi, Reno, NV, Erin Ueltschi and Johnna Ueltschi, Winter Park, FL., and her great-grandson Kaeden Edinger, Frankfort.

Additional survivors include her niece, Beth Rhody Powers (Scott), Lawrenceburg, and her nephews Todd Ueltschi (Krystal), Lawrenceburg, Matthew Rhody (Michelle), Frankfort and Kent Ueltschi (Martha), Frankfort.

Anne Dowling also leaves behind her great-nieces Whitney Rhody, Frankfort, Paige Coleman, Lexington along with her great-nephews Aidan Rhody, Frankfort, Quinton Ueltschi and Will Powers, Lawrenceburg along with Ryan and Patrick Ueltschi, Lexington.

Services for Mrs. Ueltschi will be held at Harrod Brothers Funeral Home on Tuesday, June 20, 2017, at 2:00 p.m. with Rev. Steve Pace officiating. Interment will follow at Frankfort Cemetery. Visitation will be at the funeral home from 1:00 p.m. until the service hour on Tuesday.
