Frankfort - Billy Courtney, age 80, passed away Sunday, July 6, 2014, at University of Kentucky Medical Center.

Services for Mr. Courtney will be 2:00 p.m. Wednesday, July 9, 2014, at Harrod Brothers Funeral Home with Rev. Jay Stratton officiating. Burial will follow in Sunset Memorial Gardens. Family and friends will be received at the funeral home Tuesday evening from 5-8 p.m.
