Carol went on to become a successful business owner with her husband of 55 years. They operated the Montgomery Ward Catalog Agency in Elizabethtown, Kentucky for several years. They went on to own/operate the original Burger Queens in numerous towns in Kentucky. The towns included Lawrenceburg, Stanford, Lancaster, Nicholasville and Munfordville.
