Frankfort - Cecil Bronson Cornn, 93, passed away Friday, August 29, 2014.

Services for Mr. Cornn will be 10:30 a.m. Friday, September 5, 2014, at Harrod Brothers Funeral Home. Reverend Todd Lester will officiate. Burial with military honors will follow in Sunset Memorial Gardens. Visitation will be at the funeral home Thursday from 5-8 p.m.
