He died Wednesday, July 30, 2008 in Frankfort following an illness.

Born December 23, 1929 in Franklin County, he was a U.S. Army veteran serving during the Korean War. He was retired from National Distillery/Jim Beam Brands and was a member of West Frankfort Church of God.
