He was always friendly and usually pretty patient with all the high jinks from the teenage boys. However, he put Ike off the bus one day for misbehaving -- Ike deserved it and still laughs about it. He had to walk home on Coldstream Drive from East Main in the rain. He never told his parents, because he knew he would be in bigger trouble with his dad. Mr. Hosley just grinned and let him back on the bus the next day. He never reported Ike. That was the kind of guy he was. He dealt with the infraction immediately and forgave right away.
