



Clayton Elizabeth Bradley

December 1, 1929 - December 16, 2011

Frankfort " Clayton Elizabeth Craine Bradley, 82 years, passed away Friday, December 16, 2011, at Taylor Manor Nursing Home, Versailles.

In 1958, Clayton and her husband, Scotty successfully developed and operated Scotty's Pink Pig BBQ until 1994. Clayton was the creator of many of the pies Frankfort residents still fondly remember. She was a graduate of Frankfort High School, a member of Bridgeport Christian Church having served on the church board as a Deaconess, and was elected an Elder in 1993.

She was fortunate to serve on several committees, boards and organizations, i.e., Frankfort Arts Foundation, Board of Directors, 1978-1982; National Democratic Convention Delegate, 1984; appointed to serve on The National Democratic Platform Committee, Washington DC prior to the 1984 Convention; The State Democratic Woman's Club of Kentucky, President 1986-1988; The AGO's Task Force on Child Sexual Abuse, 1992; Member of the Board of Directors of the Franklin County Interagency Council on Family Abuse, 1992; and The Governor's Council on Domestic Violence, 1996 and was associated with many other groups and organizations. Clayton, a life-long Democrat, has been actively involved in campaigns since 1983. She worked diligently to promote democratic ideals in her county, state and country.

Clayton is survived by her son, Randall S. (Becky) Bradley; a grandson, Justin (Tammy) Bradley; three great grandchildren, Aaron, Clara and Lauren; a sister, Marie Harrod; brother-in-law and sister-in-law, Eugene and Vivian Bradley; sister-in-law, Elaine Goodrich Barton; and numerous nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her husband of 59 years, Merrill Scott "Scotty" Bradley; her parents, Bronston and Katherine Wooldridge Craine and brothers, David and Raymond Craine.

Services for Clayton will be 11:00 a.m. Monday, December 19, 2011, at Harrod Brothers Funeral Home with Rev. Philip Case officiating. Burial will follow in Frankfort Cemetery. Visitation will be 3:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. Sunday at the funeral home.

Family and friends of the family will serve as pallbearers.
