Gary David Dean, 62, passed away Thursday, August 5, 2010 at his home in Frankfort surrounded by family following a long and courageous battle with cancer.

A native of Frankfort, Gary is survived by his parents Alma Dean and George Dean. Gary is also survived by his wife of 40 years, Peggy, a son, David Dean (fiancee Camille Collins) a daughter, Lee Ann Dean; sister, Donna Morris; two nephews Tony Cline and Jeffrey Cline; a great nephew, Derek Cline and a great niece, Kaitlynn Cline.

He was a 1965 graduate of Franklin County High School. He received a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from Kentucky State University and a Master of Business Administration from Xavier University.

After retiring, he combined his business skills and his love for the game of golf by starting Duckers Lake Golf Club Fitting and Repair Shop with his son.
