“ I regret this condolence is so belated. Please allow me a moment to explain. My father saw the name of his friend in the Lexington newspaper and asked me to go online to get further information. Dad studied the obituary that I gave him for several minutes. He pointed out that they were born only one day apart, Dad had been married two years longer, but Harold had many more grandchildren than he. He told me that Harold was in the first group that teamed with the boys from Williamsburg (KY) when he first arrived at Camp Shelby. Evidently, they worked closely together during the entire time they served in the South Pacific.

This all occurred one day before my parents 60th wedding anniversary. I spent the rest of the weekend making preparations and entertaining guests, reminding myself that I needed to send this email as soon as I could find the time.

Monday, Sept 10, Dad was driving back from his cardiologist in Lexington, where he got a clean bill of health. He was hit by a semi and died within a few hours. My mother has recovered from her physical injuries and is now adapting to life without her long time companion.

Especially during this holiday season, I want you to know that our family is thinking of you.

Dad's message:

I would like to offer my condolences to the family of Harold Tackett. I was in the 149th infantry, Company D with Harold from 1941 to 1945. I have many good memories of the days I served with him. He was a good man.
