Harry "Juney" Arnold, 71, of Frankfort, KY passed away on Monday, May 19, 2025. Juney was born on December 20, 1953. He graduated from Franklin County High School as a stand-out athlete participating in baseball and basketball. A graduate of Morehead State University, he was a scholarship athlete in baseball and was a member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon. He graduated in 1976, with a Bachelor of Arts in Health & Physical Education. A firefighter for the Frankfort City Fire Department he was part of the ambulance crew until retirement.

After retirement Juney enjoyed substitute teaching at Frankfort Independent Schools and coaching baseball. He also coached basketball at Western Hills High School for the Lady Wolverines and at the YMCA. Owner of Arnold Sports Farm, he offered baseball leagues and taught private lessons giving young athletes a place to develop their game. Juney was an avid Harley motorcycle rider and traveled most of the United States. He also took up farming, spent time outdoors and enjoyed hunting. He was a firm believer in his faith and a member of First Presbyterian Church of Frankfort. Most of all, Juney loved his family and making everyone around him happy. He will be remembered for being a wonderful father, husband, grandfather, uncle, coach, and friend.

The youngest of two children, he was the son of the late Harry T. and Katherine Arnold. He is survived by his wife Terry B. Arnold and his two children Jacob Arnold and Tara Arnold-Johns (Chris), and survived by one brother, Scott T. Arnold. He was a grandfather that adored his grandson, Logan Jacob Arnold. He also had a close relationship with his nieces and nephews (Scott Arnold II, John Arnold, Marc Arnold, Liz Davidson-Gentry, Greg "Boomer" Davidson, and Tad Jones)....and many friends.

Services will be held at First Presbyterian Church of Frankfort on Tuesday, May 27, 2025, at 12:00 p.m. with Rev. JT Silence officiating. Burial will follow at Sunset Memorial Gardens. Visitation will be held at Harrod Brothers Funeral Home from 5:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. on Monday, May 26, 2025.

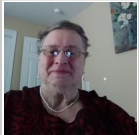
