In 1957 we moved to the Claiborne/Edlen Risk a mile down the road toward Woodlake. I was blessed to meet Herbert, Mose, Lightning, Dick and Omer Carter. They worked along with my dad Lawrence Purvis and grand dad Omer Purvis on the Marston, Wiley, Risk and Pierce farms and later Herbert and Lightning the Jack Thompson and J B Marston farms at Peaks Mill.

The Carter boys were same age as my dad, mid 20/s. Others there were Walker Miller, Church Greene, Jim West, Clifford/Georgia Thomas, Houston Vinegar, his grandson Charles/Junebug Carter, Albert Mony, Lightning Snell, Bill Bell, Dan Bell, Benny Bell, Shelby, Roscoe and Albert Miller, Joe and Kenny James and many others!

All the Carters had big contagious smiles which they were quick to share with a little kid like me while I followed them and my dad in the hay and tobacco fields. On rainy days several would meet at Jess Marston's barn across from the big house and play marbles for hours on the swept, hard barn floor in a big circle in the hard dirt 2with my dad. Affordable entertainment for poor folks!

I grewed up with the Marston, Risk, Wiley, Thompson families.

I have left out lots of info, I know. The Carters and other folks were influential in my early years and I cherish my time around all the the folks I mentioned earlier. I pray God accepts them and holds them close!!!
