



Jack Browning

April 9, 1933 - June 24, 2013

Frankfort " Jack Browning Sr. passed away at his residence in Frankfort, Kentucky, on Monday, June 24, 2013, at the age of 80. He is preceded in death by his wife of 56 years, Billie, who passed away in November of 2010.

Services for Mr. Browning will be 12:00 pm on Saturday, June 29, 2013 at Harrod Brothers Funeral Home, with Reverend Richard Wright officiating. Burial will follow at Sunset Memorial Gardens. Visitation will be Friday from 5:00 pm to 8:00 pm at the funeral home.

Jack is lovingly remembered by his sons, Taggett and Jack Jr. as well as his daughter-in-law, Gina and his grandchildren, Ryan and Raechel. There are far too many people to list whom Jack has helped, given guidance to, or has had a positive effect on. We all know who we are and we are better people for having known him.

Jack was born in Pennington Gap, Virginia, in 1933. At the age of 15 he enlisted for a two year tour of duty with the United States Army. Near the end of those two years, he was sent to Korea. He saw approximately two weeks of combat and was then captured along with what remained of the division he deployed with. For the over three years he remained a prisoner of war, first with the North Koreans, then with the Chinese. After returning home, Jack went to barber school and eventually became owner of his own barbershop as well as the property and associated shops.

Jack enjoyed collecting and shooting guns, and collecting coins. He also enjoyed working with his hands, as was evident by all the major woodworking projects he had undertaken and completed. Traveling to some of the local forests and national camp grounds was also an enjoyment for Jack. The church was also a very big part of his life.
