Jean Triplett Demerson, died peacefully Monday, May 25, 2009.

She was born January 23, 1929 in Frankfort, Kentucky to the late Dudley and Beulah Rodgers Triplett. She is survived by her husband of 53 years, Theo (Buddy) Demerson and three daughters, Ann Leslie Mitchell (David) of Lexington, Ellen Kaye Barnard, Jan Dudley Lile (Mark) both from Frankfort; seven grandchildren: Rebecca James Mitchell of Savannah, GA, Suzanna Kaye Mitchell, Robert David Holden Mitchell of Lexington, Anna Jean Barnard of Long Beach, California and James (Jas) O♦Rear Barnard of Frankfort, Taylor Demerson Lile and Russell Woods Lile of Frankfort; and a niece, Kaye Beckett Triplett of Frankfort.
