Joe continued this service by joining the Kentucky Army National Guard and became an accomplished

Helicopter Crew Chief. His love for Huey✦s and Black Hawks ran deep. Joe retired from the Kentucky Army National Guard in 2002. Thanks to his 20 plus year career as a bus driver for the Franklin County School System, he literally knew everyone in and around town, and the children he cared for year over year will joyfully express their abundance of love for Joe. He was a true jack of all trades demonstrated by his many talents which included musician, quartet singer, handyman, gardener, whistler extraordinaire, Santa substitute when the jolly old elf needed a stand in, teacher/trainer, truck driver, dancer (famous for doing the funky chicken), excellent swimmer, fisherman, and the list goes on and on.
