We met at a local establishment both enjoying good company and good frivolity that only two brothers embarking upon a journey can have. After indulging in the local hospitality offered, we determined that nourishment was needed and unfortunately was not provided at this local establishment.

Having concurred that a vehicle was not at our disposal, as we both knew we could not drive safely, we decided to traverse the landscape on foot to another local establishment known as "The Farmers Kitchen";. Following a goat path full of thorns, (I still have scars), rocky hills and mud, our eyes were elated to find a glowing sign that read "The Ye Ole Farmers Kitchen";. Hungrily, we entered this establishment only to find that no seats were available. But because of my friend Wesley's vast knowledge of locals in this area, we were able to find a seat at one of his friend's table. I immediately gorged myself upon the feast that was offered only to find out that it was not mine to eat. Wesley apologized for my actions but I insisted that I was merely hungry and needed not his intervention. Before the local constabulary arrived, we hastily retreated across a four-lane highway to safety. Having escaped, we immediately made our way to the sanctuary of his truck--a vehicle with accommodations for two. Our sleep was uninterrupted until the next day when I proceeded home afoot.

Upon arrival, I found my wife waiting for me - hugging me when I walked in the door. She was so relieved that I was alive.
