



Joseph "Tim" Conradus Pyles

April 30, 1951 - December 19, 2024

The family of Joseph C. Pyles sadly announce his passing on December 19, 2024, at The Willows at Citation in Lexington, at the age of 73, with his wife beside him.

Left to cherish his memory are his wife Charlotte; his children, Sandra (Travis) Gardner, Robert Scott Pyles, Laura (Drew Mindell) Pyles; and grandchildren, Tyler, Shelby, Erin, Sam, Aubrey, Dominik, and Zakk. He will be deeply missed by his siblings James Leslie Pyles, Dianna Lynn (Dennis) Morrison, Robert David Pyles, and Sarah Jo (Dale) Jeffries, and a network of extended family and friends. Tim was predeceased by his parents Lt. Col. Leslie Carlisle and Elizabeth Bray Pyles, and brother Daniel Bray (Sherry) Pyles.

Joseph "Tim" Conradus Pyles was born on April 30, 1951 in Frankfort. The first of six children, Tim and his siblings spent their childhood growing up throughout Kentucky, following their father's job as a Kentucky State Police Officer. The family settled in Shelbyville when the kids got older, where Tim graduated from Shelby County High School in 1969.

Tim graduated with a Bachelor of Science, Civil Engineering in 1973 and a Master of Science, Civil Engineering in 1975, both from the University of Kentucky. Tim was proud of his 50 year career as a structural engineer, where he spent 20 years with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, 20 years with

Hayworth Meyer and Boleyn, and five years with WMB, Inc. After his retirement in 2019, Tim was appointed by Governor Andy Beshear to the Kentucky Board of Engineers and Land Surveyors, contributing to the next generation of engineers. Over his career he designed bridges and oversaw projects that now connect communities in Kentucky, Indiana, West Virginia, and Tennessee. He was particularly proud of his work for the tower foundations at Maceo.

Outside of his work, Tim was most proud of helping his wife to raise their three children, and spending time with his grandchildren. He showed his love and affection for them with multiple nicknames. Tim was a lifelong learner and enjoyed sharing his wealth of knowledge. He always had a fact to share about any topic or issue. He loved to travel across the United States and Canada with Charlotte, hike with their dog Gus, read, practice photography, and stargaze. He learned to cook later in life and took joy in cooking family recipes, especially those his mother made when he was a child.

A celebration of life will take place on Friday, December 27, 2024, at 11:00 a.m. at The Elizabeth in Frankfort.
