Frankfort – Judy Carol Hillard, age 72, passed away on Wednesday, June 16, 2021, after a three-and-a-half-year battle with cancer. A Celebration of Life will be held at Forks of Elkhorn Baptist Church on Thursday, June 24, 2021, at 1:00 p.m. with Rev. Todd Lester officiating.
