Frankfort – Kenneth Coleman Wood, age 85, passed away Thursday, February 15, 2018 in Frankfort. Services will be held at Harrod Brothers Funeral Home on Tuesday, February 20, 2018, at 10:00 a.m. with Rev. Everett Hawkins officiating. Burial will follow at Frankfort Cemetery. Visitation will be held at Harrod Brothers Funeral Home from 5:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. on Monday, February 19, 2018.

Mr. Wood was born in Frankfort on August 4, 1932 to the late Evan A. and S. Elizabeth Wood. He retired after owning and operating Wood Insurance Company for over 50 years. He served as a Frankfort City Commissioner, Kentucky State Representative, and Director of Motor Vehicle Enforcement of the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet. In addition, he was a Colonel from the Kentucky National Guard, as well as a Veteran of the United States Army. He served on the Board of Directors for Kentucky Growers Insurance, as well as was a longtime member of the Franklin County Democratic Executive Committee. He was a member of Faith Baptist Church.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his siblings, James Elmer Wood, Harold Wood, Ruth Wood, Fred Wood, and Elaine Cottrell.

He is survived by his children, Janice Hines (Kerry); Lea Anne Wood; and Brian Wood (Jessica); his sister, Gladys Manning; grandchildren, Amber Blackburn (Justin), Abby Lossen, Jack Wood, Samuel Wood, and Grace Wood; great-grandchildren, Dalton Blackburn and Jude Blackburn; and several nieces and nephews.
