Lane Vincent Rogers, 31, of Lexington, Kentucky, entered into rest on December 15, 2025.

Born on August 14, 1994, in Versailles, Kentucky, Lane was a beloved son, brother, uncle, and friend. A proud Kentuckian, he carried a deep love for his home state wherever life took him. Lane lived authentically, embracing his identity and encouraging others to do the same.

Lane attended Woodford County High School, where he was a member of the wrestling team, and later earned his GED. At the time of his passing, he was pursuing a degree at the University of Kentucky.

Lane's greatest passion was horses. Inspired by his mother, he returned to riding and rediscovered a deep love for them. He spent countless hours at the farm caring for, training with, and rescuing horses alongside his mother, girlfriend, and farm family. This passion reflected his deep connection to Kentucky—its land, its traditions, and the quiet moments that grounded him. It was the same connection that drew him to the state's music, arts, sports, and strong sense of community.

Lane loved to travel and spent much of the last decade on the move, with future trips already planned. He was especially drawn to journeys by train, cherishing the scenery and stories along the way. Travel also gave him the chance to follow the teams he loved, including the Los Angeles Rams. He loved food—anything from a big steak to a late-night Waffle House run—but more importantly, he valued the connections and memories created by sharing meals with friends.

Lane was preceded in death by his beloved dog, Bandit.

He is survived by his mother, Kerry Lowary, and stepfather, Bill Klier; his father, Vince Rogers and his wife, Cyndie; his sister, Lyndsay and her daughter; his brother, Lucas, his wife Blair, and their four children; his girlfriend, Lauren Mansky; and his many cherished friends.
