Frankfort-Larry Wayne Tucker, 62 yrs., of Frankfort, passed away on Friday, April 23, 2010. Visitation will be Tuesday, April 27, 2010, from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at Harrod Brothers Funeral Home. A private Memorial Service will be conducted at a later time.

A native of Franklin Co., he was born June 28, 1947, and was a U.S. Army Veteran during the Vietnam Conflict. Mr. Tucker retired as a Lieutenant from the Frankfort Fire Department with twenty-five years of service. He was a member of the American Legion Post 7 and the VFW Post 4075.
