Frankfort "Lida Mae (Montgomery) Gobber, 98 of Frankfort, KY died Friday, January 16, 2009 at Frankfort Regional Hospital with her family at her side. Lida was born in Frankfort, KY. She was a loving Mother, Granny, Great-Granny and Great-Great Granny. She was a registered nurse and practiced her profession over forty-five years at the Kings Daughters Hospital in Frankfort. She retired in 1974. If you were born or gave birth in Frankfort during this time, Lida probably had a great deal to do with that event. She spent most of her career as an OB nurse working unselfishly in the service of her mothers and babies.

Lida was an active member of Immanuel Baptist Church and a faithful servant of Jesus Christ. She was a member of Esther Sunday School Class, Kentucky Nursing Association, Senior Citizens, OBGYN National Society of Nurses and Order of Eastern Star Hiram 93.

After retirement from nursing her greatest joy was being with and supporting her family. She attended uncounted ballgames watching grandchildren and great grandchildren participate. She was an avid University of Kentucky fan and seldom missed a TV or radio game. She loved bingo which she played well into her nineties. She also loved bridge which was her favorite card game. Lida never met a stranger and always welcomed anyone into her home. She managed to live on her own until this past year when she took up

residence at the assisted living facility The Bee Hive in Frankfort.
