Frankfort" Martha Ueltschi Penn, 90, a former resident of Ashwood, widow of Charles H. Penn, died following an illness. She was the daughter of Elsie and Ernest Ueltschi of Frankfort. She was a registered nurse for 41 years, retiring from the Veterans Hospital, Lexington in 1984. Mrs. Penn worked at the old Kings Daughters Hospital in the emergency room prior to going to VA. She was a decorated WWII veteran having served with the 35th Evacuation hospital in the Third Army.

She is survived by two sons, Ronald Howard Penn (Debbie) and Charles Michael Penn (Rhoda); two grandsons, James Michael Penn and Brandon Howard Penn (Molly) and granddaughter, Kristin Michelle Carmack (Jeremy). She is also survived by three great granddaughters; niece, Martha Ann Buchwald and nephew, William Frank Buchwald (Brenda).

She was preceded in death by three sisters, Ida and Margerite Ueltschi, Emmy Buchwald and brother, Frank Ueltschi.

She was a member of the South Frankfort Presbyterian Church, the American Nurses Association, Senior Citizens of Franklin County, volunteer for Hospice of the Bluegrass, member of the American Legion, VFW and a Kentucky Colonel.

Mrs. Penn has bequested her body to the University of Kentucky for the advancement of medical science and education. She was also an organ donor.

There will be a memorial service at Harrod Brothers Memorial Chapel Thursday, December 3, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. Visitation will be Thursday from 2 p.m. until the service.
