With great sadness, we announce the peaceful passing of Patricia "Tish Ann" Sarin (Pluckebaum), a deeply loved wife, mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, sister, and friend. Pat was born on March 23, 1939, in Louisville, Kentucky, and most recently resided in Frankfort, KY.

Pat grew up along the cherished banks of Harrods Creek, where she developed a lifelong love of boating, nature, and laughter. Some of her fondest memories were spent boating on the Ohio River as a proud "river rat," skillfully piloting her boat equally as well as her father, Arthur Pluckebaum, a talented and respected craftsman boatbuilder. She is survived by her brother, Dennis Pluckebaum (Gail), and many dear relatives locally and across the world in India.
