After being honorably discharged, Robert returned to Frankfort where he worked as a barber for 62 years, and also worked as a security guard for KSP Facilities Security and Keeneland. He was a simple man who loved his family, especially his grandchildren, fishing, and horse racing. Mr. O'Nan was a member of First Christian Church and V.F.W. Post 4075.
