



## Samuel Thomas Smither

September 19, 1932 - July 9, 2016

Samuel Thomas (S.T.) Smither, 83, beloved husband of Ann Marion (Rambo) Smither for 59 years, entered into eternal peace on July 9, 2016, in St. Petersburg, FL.

S.T. was born in Frankfort, where he lived most of his life. He was a devoted husband, father and grandfather. He graduated from Peaks Mill High School and attended Bowling Green Business University. During the Korean War he served in the US Air Force (1951-1954) and he later served in the Kentucky Air National Guard. He retired from Farmers Bank & Capital Trust Company as Senior Vice President.

S.T. was a charter member of Capital City Christian Church, serving as deacon and elder, and attended Faith Covenant Church in St. Petersburg. He served on the Franklin County Extension Board for 19 years, on the boards of the Frankfort Chamber of Commerce and the Frankfort YMCA, and was a member of the American Legion.

In addition to his wife, Ann Marion, he is survived by his children, Julie Mitchum (Gary) of St. Petersburg, FL, and Brad Smither (Lisa) of Frankfort; his grandchildren, Sam Wishard, Doug Mitchum, Hannah Smither and Grant Smither; and his nieces, Sherry Serafini (Martin) and Kim Smither.

S.T. was preceded in death by his parents, Grant C. and Bessie Shelton Smither, and his brother, Leslie Eugene Smither.

A celebration of S.T.'s life will be held at 2 pm on Saturday, July 16, at Capital City Christian Church with Rev. Jon Sutphin and Dr. Steve Pattison

officiating. Burial will follow at Peaks Mill Cemetery. Friends and family may visit from 11:30 am until the time of the service.
