A native of Junction City, Ky, he was born February 13, 1925. He was a veteran of the US Army and served during the Korean Conflict. He worked for the Danville Fire Department, was the Fire Chief for the Harrodsburg Fire Department, the Boyle County Fire Commissioner, the Kentucky State Fire Marshall, the President of Kentucky Fireman's Kentucky State Fire Marshall, the President of Kentucky Fireman's Association, an insurance inspector for Kentucky State Government and an instructor state wide for firefighters.

Mr. Boyd is survived by his daughter, Rebecca Boyd, Lexington; a brother, James W. Boyd, Lawrenceburg; a half-brother, C. Wayne Byrd, Harrodsburg.

He was the son of the late Alfred Boyd and Lola Phillips Boyd Byrd and was
