



Sue Hatton

November 29, 1940 - March 22, 2024

Surrounded by loved ones, Brenda Sue (Thomas) Hatton, 83, passed away at Frankfort Regional Medical Center on March 22, 2024.

Graveside services will be held at Swtizer Cemetery on Friday, March 29, 2024, at 10:30 a.m. with Bro. Jay Stratton officiating.

Sue was born in Beattyville, KY in 1940 to Bill and Imogene Thomas. One of seven children, she was proud of her mountain roots and honored the history and traditions of her hometown. She graduated from Lee County High School in 1960 and attended the University of Kentucky for one year before she married the love of her life, Carl Hatton, on October 20, 1962. They had four children together and made themselves prominent members of the Frankfort, KY community. They settled into a home on Pea Ridge Road and leased a farm, raising tobacco for 17 years, before moving to their residence on Switzer Road in 1987.

Sue retired from Farmers Bank after nearly 20 years. She was also a very active member of North Fork Baptist and Choateville Christian Church. In her own time, Sue had a passion for cooking and gardening. She loved her orchids, crape myrtles, and tending to her garden. Sue was widely known for her hospitality, and many stories have been shared sitting on the front porch or around her kitchen table. She always made sure the company never left

hungry- her most requested dish was soup-beans and hot water cornbread. Sue also loved to listen to gospel singer David Phelps. She spent many evenings enjoying his music, and recently traveled to Tennessee and Ashland to attend his concerts. She also enjoyed her time spent in Land O'Lakes, FL, and loved to go fishing off the dock with her friends.

Sue's favorite roles were that of wife, mother, and grandmother. She loved her family fiercely, always looked after and cared for them, unwavering in her support. Lovingly referred to as Nana, her five grandchildren were prominent figures in her home. Sue always hosted birthday parties with the entire family, cooking dinner and favorite desserts. She had a playful sense of humor and loved to tease and joke with her family.

She was preceded in death by her parents Bill and Imogene Thomas, her brothers Bill Thomas, Bob Thomas, and Larry Thomas, and her eldest daughter, Teresa Hatton (b.1963-d.1984). Carl and Sue established the Teresa Hatton Foundation in 1985, honoring their daughter through its mission to aid the mentally challenged by providing housing and habilitation.

She is survived by her husband of 61 years, Carl Hatton; sister Marlene Thorpe (of Georgetown); brothers Donald Thomas (Frankfort) and Mike Thomas (Georgetown); daughters Lisa Hatton, Angie Marshall, Beth Whitaker (all of Frankfort); grandchildren Zachary Marshall, Nathaniel Cox, Ava Masters, DeLaney and Peyton Whitaker (all of Frankfort). Her memory will live on through her extended family members and friends near and far. She will be missed by all who knew and loved her.
