Mrs. Hoge passed away peacefully at home Friday, October 21, 2016. She was born in Frankfort December 16, 1925, the daughter of the late Frank Gregory Stagg, Jr. and Susan Calhoun McElroy. She was united in marriage to Charles Mason Hoge in May, 1948, who preceded her in death. Billie Mac attended the University of Kentucky and was a member of Chi Omega Sorority. She and Charlie were former owners of Chenault and Hoge Insurance. She was a realtor, a former state employee, a member of the Colonial Dames, Silent Workers Circle and a lifelong member of First Presbyterian Church where she was a Trustee. She was active in the community serving as president of Frankfort Board of Realtors, on the board of Salvation Army and the Board of State National Bank, now Whitaker Bank. She was the first female in Franklin County to be elected to a bank board.

She is survived by a sister, Lynn Turner Shea and seven nieces and nephews, Mary Keenon Welsh, Pollyann Coblin, Willa McElroy Sweeney, William Wells Harrod, Jr., Woolfolk Hoge Blakemore, Frank Stagg Rodgers, and Martha Milam Carlin.

In addition to her parents and husband, she was preceded in death by her sisters, Mary Milam Stagg Harrod, and Suzanne Gregory Stagg Rodgers.
