Frankfort – William Oatts “Bill” McClure, age 72, passed away at home on Tuesday, June 8, 2021. Mr. McClure was born in Somerset, Kentucky, on August 6, 1948, to the late Joseph F. McClure and Anna Russell Oatts McClure.
